And the serpent said unto the woman: 'Ye shall not surely die; for God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as God, knowing good and evil.' ("Genesis" 3- -4-5)

And Joseph said unto them: 'What deed is this that ye have done? know ye not that such a man as I will indeed divine?' ("Genesis" 44- -15)

And Joseph said unto his brethren: 'Come near to me, I pray you.' And they came near. And he said: 'I am Joseph your brother, whom ye sold into Egypt. And now be not grieved, nor angry with yourselves, that ye sold me hither; for God did send me before you to preserve life. For these two years hath the famine been in the land; and there are yet five years, in which there shall be neither plowing nor harvest. And God sent me before you to give you a remnant on the earth, and to save you alive for a great deliverance. So now it was not you that sent me hither, but God; and He hath made me a father to Pharaoh ((Senusret II)), and lord of all his house, and ruler over all the land of Egypt...' ("Genesis" 45- 4-8) The Pyramid of Joseph must be that small pyramid on the northren side of the Pyramid of Pharaoh Senusret II.

The Bahr Yusef canal (south of the Pyramid of Pharaoh Senusret II) follows the Nile from "Asyut" (at the 15th Nome) and runs parallel to the great river's western bank, ending at Lake Qarun (the ancient lake Moeris), for the purpose of developing an artificial oasis at Faiyum - under the orders of Pharaoh Senusret II – no doubt in order to settle the family of Israel in the "Land of Goshen".

It is his name of this envdevour which allows us to establish that it was no other then Joseph, the beloved ruler of ancient Egypt, who executed the digging of this canal, that such a man did in fact exist, and that such a responsibility was taken: it is the name that was preserved under the orders of Pharaoh Senusret II as the title of a historical monument, the "Bahr Yusef" Canal.

It thus follows that it was Pharaoh Senusret II who gave Joseph the title ("Genesis" 45--8) "A father to Pharaoh"... In such a view, the small pyramid on the northren side of the Pyramid of Pharaoh Senusret II - must be the Pyramid of Joseph.

If so, one can claim that it was (Senusret II) "Pharaoh Khakheperre" of Dynasty XII who ordered to settle Israel ("Genesis" 47--11) at the Land of Ramsses in "Goshen" (at Faiyum) and to give that land to Israel as proprietary.

Jacob-Israel at the age of 130 ("Genesis" 47- -9) came into Egypt at Year 6 of Senusret II: As fulfillment of a prophecy to settle Israel in Egypt ("Genesis" 15- -13).

An Eternal, historical documentation appears in the drawn message (that must have been documented by Joseph) on the northern wall of the tomb of Count Khnumhotep II at Beni-Hasan, as a "Point in Time" -- "In the year 6 of Pharaoh Khakheperre"... (1927- B.C.)

And God saw... and knew... (1497- B.C.) ("Exodus" 2- -25)

Now the time that the children of Israel dwelt in Egypt was four hundred and thirty years. ("Exodus" 12- -40)
